- The two categories are as follows:

 - B. Crumb Topping Apple Pie
- Only one recipe per person will be accepted per apple pie contest category.
- A total of 20 apple pies will be accepted for the day's competition for each category.
- Recipes will be accepted until December 31, 2011.
- Finalists will be notified by January 10, 2012.

Favorite Apple Recipe INFORMATION

- Contestants may enter multiple recipes for this contest.
- Recipe's main ingredient must be apples.
- A total of 20 recipes will be accepted for judging.
- Pie recipes **will not** be accepted in this category.
- Recipes will be accepted until December 31, 2011.
- Finalists will be notified by January 10, 2012.

RULES

1. A \$5 registration fee per recipe is required. All registration fees will be returned to entries not selected as finalists for competition.
2. Recipes must include Michigan Apples (please include variety -- no Granny Smith apples). Check MichiganApples.com for a complete list of Michigan Apple varieties.
3. Recipes must use Pioneer Sugar.
4. Recipes must be received by December 31, 2011.
5. Finalists must be present during contest and judging.
6. Recipes become property of Zehnder's of Frankenmuth, Michigan Sugar, Michigan Apple Committee, WSGW Radio and The Maytag Store .
7. Each finalist will be asked to bring his or her prepared pie or favorite recipe to the contest at Zehnder's of Frankenmuth on Wednesday, January 25, 2012.
8. Finalist's finished recipe will be judged on appearance, taste and overall impression.
9. First place winner in the pie contest automatically becomes a judge for next year's contest.
10. Contestant must be a Michigan resident.
11. Eligibility: Amateur cooks/bakers must be 18 and older only. An amateur cook/baker is any person who does not make the major portion of his or her income baking or cooking.
